

### **About CHAZ**

The Churches Health Association of Zambia (CHAZ) is an inter-denominational (Catholic and Protestants) umbrella organization for Church Health Institutions (CHIs) in Zambia. It was established in 1970, to advocate, mobilize resources, provide technical and logistical support, represent and coordinate the work of Church health hospitals. In this regard, the CHAZ Secretariat is the technical wing of the Church health sector.

CHAZ currently has a membership of 162 health facilities; 47 hospitals, 75 health centres and health posts, 18 Community-based faith organizations 6 specialized Hospitals and 16 training schools. The majority of these health institutions are located in rural and hard-to-reach areas, and are present in all the 10 administrative provinces of Zambia, serving the general population, with a particular focus on the poor and the underserved. It is estimated that these health facilities and community-based faith organizations altogether, serve about 8 million people with health care and health-related programs respectively.



### **Our Bicycle**

#### Design

Many people living in the developing world struggle to overcome the barrier of distance to access education, healthcare and economic opportunities. Compared to walking, bicycles allow them to travel farther, haul more goods over longer distances and in less time – provided the bicycle is strong and durable. Unfortunately, there has been a disconnect between suppliers and end-users which has resulted in bicycles designed to be inexpensive rather than robust; most begin to fall apart within weeks because they are not suitable for rugged terrain and bulky loads. This has dire consequences for people without access to other modes of transportation.

As World Bicycle Relief's wholly-owned social enterprise subsidiary, Buffalo Bicycle Ltd. is committed to providing the highest quality, most durable bicycles in the developing world. We operate with constant attention to quality innovation and product improvement to ensure that our bicycles meet their users' needs - students, healthcare workers, farmers and entrepreneurs.

Our motto is that "All answers are found in the field". We have dedicated significant resources and personnel for ongoing field and laboratory testing, product development and supply chain and quality control management that leverage our partnerships with bicycle industry leaders. Our product management team oversees a fleet of riders who test current and potential components under the most punishing field conditions; their feedback is used by our supply chain team to improve our bicycle design with strict quality controls.

#### **Assembly**

Buffalo Bicycles are sourced from manufacturers in Asia who produce each component to our specifications. Our bicycles are built using the highest quality parts. The bicycles arrive

completely unassembled at Buffalo Bicycle facilities in Africa where locally trained teams put them together. Our assembly team take great pride in their work and ensure that each bicycle is properly assembled. In regions where Buffalo does not have an assembly facility, we are able to ship 95% quality assembled bicycles from our suppliers.

#### **Maintenance**

Even the most robust bicycle needs maintenance, particularly in the harsh conditions of the developing world. Each Buffalo Bicycle comes with a pump, a cable-lock and a utility tool for basic maintenance. To ensure that bicycle owners have access to local, qualified repair service, Buffalo Bicycles has developed a Field Mechanics Training Program to accompany bicycle distribution. Mechanics are trained in bicycle assembly, maintenance and repair as well as basic business, marketing and management skills. Each trained mechanic receives a set of bicycle tools, and some mechanics establish businesses and purchase a stock of spare parts.

#### **Branding**

Why Buffalo? Buffalo Bicycles are built to be as tough as the fierce African buffalo, a symbol of strength and power; hence the brand name Buffalo Bicycles. All Buffalo Bicycles and spare parts are carefully branded to assure the end-users that they have purchased the genuine product rather than a low-quality imitation. In addition, Buffalo Bicycle can offer customized branding options with specified minimum order quantities.

#### **Awards**

The Schwab Foundation for Social Entrepreneurship and World Economic Forum recognised, Buffalo Bicycle Ltd, with the 2013 Award for Social Entrepreneurship. The Entrepreneur of the Year award acknowledges innovative approaches and outstanding work in health, education, employment and the environment.
